Admissions Index formula for **GRE tests taken prior to August 1, 2011:**
 $(\text{GPA} * 200) + \text{GRE Verbal and Quantitative combined score}$

Admissions Index formula for **GRE tests taken on or after August 1, 2011:**
 $(\text{GPA} * 200) + (15 * (\text{GRE Verbal and Quantitative combined score} - 260))$

<p>Admissions index of 1,400 or higher (for GRE tests taken prior to August 1, 2011)</p> <p>Admissions index of 980 or higher (for GRE tests taken on or after August 1, 2011)</p>	<p>Students are admitted, so long as they meet any additional criteria specific to a particular degree program. Students who are denied admission may discuss their options with an academic advisor.</p>
<p>Admissions index of 1,300-1,399 (for GRE tests taken prior to August 1, 2011)</p> <p>Admissions index of 890-979 (for GRE tests taken on or after August 1, 2011)</p>	<p>Students may be admitted by the dean of the school, considering scores on the analytic portion of the GRE (or equivalent), grades in particularly relevant courses, or other relevant indicators of a student's potential to success in a given graduate degree program. Such admission may be conditional or probationary with initial coursework specified. Students who are denied admission may discuss their options with an academic advisor.</p>
<p>Admissions index below 1,300 (for GRE tests taken prior to August 1, 2011)</p> <p>Admissions index below 890 (for GRE tests taken on or after August 1, 2011)</p>	<p>Students will not be admitted and may not appeal the decision. Students who are denied admission may discuss their options with an academic advisor.</p>
