**2 + 2 Transfer Plan for
Houston Community College
And
The University of Houston-Victoria
For the 2016 – 2017 Academic Year**

The University of Houston-Victoria offers this 2+2 plan as a companion guide to Houston Community College (lower division) catalog and the UH-Victoria (upper division) catalog. This is a plan to guide you along the way to a four-year degree. We suggest you review the plan for your major of choice first with your counselor at Houston Community College. Then, schedule an appointment with the degree plan counselor for your intended major at UHV.

The University of Houston-Victoria and Houston Community College have agreed to articulate the courses contained in these degree plans to enable students to transfer by the most efficient means. The articulation agreement is available in the Office of the Provost/Vice President for Academic Affairs at UHV. The program regulations listed in the agreement are summarized here: Students who interrupt their enrollment for more than 12 months will be governed by the catalog in effect at the time they return to HCC or UHV. A student may be covered under the same UHV catalog for up to 10 years from the date of the first enrollment at HCC. The student will be required to comply with curriculum changes made after the catalog year in which the student is first eligible, but no student will have an overall appreciable increase in total credit hours required for graduation. Students must apply to UHV and meet university and program admissions requirements. During the first semester at UHV, the student should finalize an official degree plan. UHV must approve any substantial changes in HCC course descriptions or course hours or have the option of selecting a replacement course. Students who change their major are subject to requirements in effect at the time the change is made.

Please note that we have listed courses in order with prerequisite requirements. This listing is useful as a guide to give you an idea of what to take. Keep in mind that some courses are offered only during specific semesters. To plan your program, please refer to course schedules from HCC and UHV and consult with your academic advisors.

You, the student, are responsible for all requirements of the catalog under which you are to be graduated. For students with 45 hours or more, a degree plan counselor in the academic school will initiate your degree plan during your first semester of attendance at UHV. Students with less than 45 hours should meet with an academic advisor or Student Success Coach to discuss course selection.

TUITION REBATE FOR CERTAIN UNDERGRADUATES

**Two Plus Two Transfer Program
Articulation Agreement between**

**Houston Community College
and
University of Houston-Victoria**

PURPOSE

In order to enhance the quality and accessibility of higher education, to facilitate the transfer of degree seeking students who begin their academic work at Houston Community College and then transfer to the University of Houston-Victoria to complete their bachelor's degree, and to strengthen the partnership between our institutions, Houston Community College (HCC) and the University of Houston-Victoria (UHV), we do hereby enter into a formal Articulation Agreement. This agreement and the transfer plans will be accessible from the home pages of both institutions via the World Wide Web making them readily accessible to students and counselors of both schools.

ACADEMIC PROVISIONS


- HCC students who have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (on a scale of 4.0), and who meet all UHV admissions requirements may be admitted to UHV.
- UHV understands HCCS' mission of educating individuals enrolled in its programs, serving the needs of the community within its district boundaries and of awarding two-year associate degrees. This agreement will allow for a process to permit eligible and interested students to transfer certain course work from UHV to HCCS to complete requirements for the associate degree issued by HCCS. This process is called **reverse transfer** or **reverse articulation**. Students enrolled at UHV who previously attended HCCS or are currently enrolled at HCCS and meet HCCS' resident credit requirement of 18 semester credit hours will be eligible for reverse transfer credit.
- HCC students who have completed the UHV/HCC transfer guide, will receive credit for the courses identified in the transfer guide toward the baccalaureate degree at UHV.
- Each institution will support students in the completion of programs and degrees.

OTHER PROVISIONS


- Both institutions will strive to provide students with "seamless" access from HCC to UHV.
- Representatives from both institutions will confer at least on an annual basis to evaluate the success of this agreement, to update the agreement and/or any attachments in regards to curriculum changes, and to consider any request for amendments.
- Additional programmatic articulations will be developed as deemed necessary by both institutions.

SIGNATURES, AMENDMENTS AND TERMINATION:

This agreement becomes effective upon the signing of both parties and shall continue in effect until both parties agree in writing to modify or terminate the agreement. Termination of the agreement shall become effective ninety (90) days after written notice is given.

Admission to University of Houston-Victoria

Undergraduate Admission Requirements:

You are eligible to enter UH-Victoria if you have earned at least a 2.0 (A=4.0) cumulative grade point average in all non-remedial college level coursework and must have completed all parts of the Texas Success Initiative (TSI).

How to Apply for Undergraduate Admission:

To be considered for admission, the following credentials must be submitted to the UHV Office of Admissions and Student Recruitment:

1. A completed UHV application for admission.
2. An official transcript from each college attended must be sent directly to the UHV Office of Admissions and Student Recruitment from each institution. By requesting electronic transmission, you may shorten the application processing time by two or three days.
3. Minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale in all non-remedial college level coursework. In addition, before enrolling, students must show completion of Texas Success Initiative (TSI) requirements or show college readiness according to provisions of the TSI and UHV and, Students under the age of 22 must submit proof of Bacterial Meningitis Immunization prior to registering for courses.

Scholarships and Financial Aid

UH-Victoria administers a wide range of scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study employment for students who qualify. Some of the scholarships are non-need based. It is to the student's advantage to complete an application for financial assistance as early as possible since limited funds require that priority be given the earliest applicants.
